Jamie Joyce, founder of Southwest Iowa Sports Foundation is presenting a \$1,000.00 check to Shrine Hospitals for Children. Dale Gross of the Nishna Valley Shrine club is accepting the check on behalf of the Shrine Hospitals. The funds are a result of a "Heads-up-Racing" event held at the Atlantic Municipal Airport on September 16.

Jamie says, "The idea started when I was at the Atlantic fest car show in 2016. I thought it would be fun to be able to see the cars in action rather than just looking at them parked on the curb. It started out with the intention of having about 30 cars and a couple hundred spectators. Just a small "get together". Once the word got out – it started to roll.

"I asked Mr. Gross if he thought the Shrine Hospitals would appreciate a donation from the proceeds. He began checking on Shrine involvement, rules and insurance issues. He found that so long as the beneficiary of the event was to be the Hospitals, it was ok to accept the proceeds.

"There was a small group of close friends that jumped on board to help. As we progress we got more help from other local car lovers. I had people coming up to me asking "have you heard about the drag race at the airport"? Nobody knew who was behind it or what it was all about. They just knew it was happening.

"We worked on legal issues, insurance, food and pop vendors, safety, policies, volunteers, promotion – lots of things. We were busy. We managed to pull it off in less than 60 days.

"We received donations from many Atlantic businesses to cover the initial expenses. Small town Atlantic has some of the most "giving" folks you can imagine. They were particularly excited to know that the Shrine Hospitals were to benefit. I didn't want this to be a money making thing for me or my committee so we decided that we would save back a little seed money for next year and donate the rest to the Shrine Hospitals. That created even more public excitement.

"The Shriner Pacers Club showed up with a few parade cars were the first ones to race down the 1/8 mile track. The crowd got a kick out of that.

"Everything was safe as the cars had to pass a "tech" inspection before entering the race. The race was delayed a bit at times by Mother Nature. Rain came and went a few times. Luckily there were only a few delays due to weather. Despite the weather, we still had over 1500 spectators (free admission) We had 200 participants show up. For a \$20 admission and they could run their cars as often as they wished. Not bad for a rainy day!

"It kind of turned into a mini Woodstock. There were racers from Texas, Kansas, Nebraska, South Dakota and all over Iowa.

"I was really impressed with the number of local people that volunteered. They helped with set up in the morning and tear down in the evening. The volunteers hauled bleachers in and out, inspected

cars, picked up trash, set up barricades and parked cars. It went on all day long.

"There is an incredibly amount of things that have to be done at an event like this. We plan to do it again next year."
