Rainbow, Brooks or Browns- we didn't care what we caught as long as they were biting. We were told that they were biting, we just had to find them. After coffee and a breakfast of biscuits and gravy on Saturday morning, we grabbed our gear and headed to the stream.

This trip we will not pull campers, but rather look into staying at a small, family owned motel that can cater to our needs. Plans are also in the works for other outings throughout the summer. 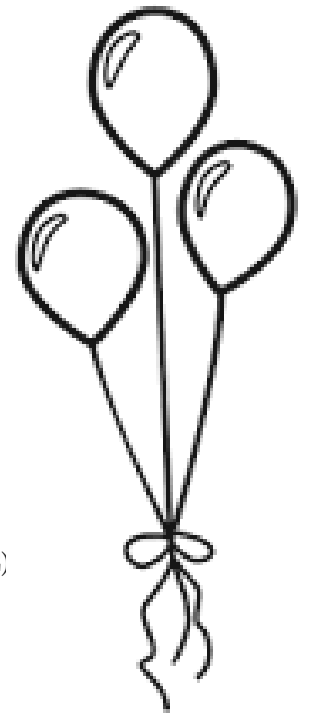
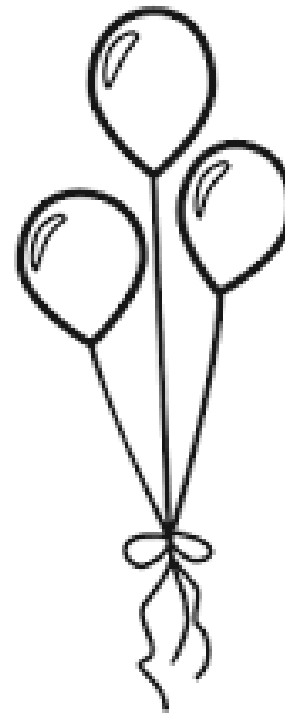

Shriner Strongman Competition 2018

The 2018 Shriner Strongman/Highland Games, and Arm Wrestling competition was held at Za-Ga-Zig Shrine Center on May 12th, and the attendance was outstanding. Several of the competitors enjoyed an awesome omelet breakfast from the Zig-Zaggers softball team before competition. This was the third year in a row for this growing event. A big thanks to Charles Clayton, Arron Cramer, and to our grill guy John Roach, the Altoona DeMolay Chapter, and everyone else for helping to make this a success again this year!

There were over 56 competitors for the strongman competition alone coming from as far away as South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Missouri, Illinois, Minnesota, New York, Tennessee, and Michigan. They also brought their fans as well, and they got to see how accommodating the Za-Ga-Zig Shriners are!

In addition, Za-Ga-Zig had our very own Arron Cramer competing in the Super Heavy Weight Division and winning again this year! Way to go Arron, and thanks for carrying the colors for Za-Ga-Zig! We saw both men as well as women competing in their respective divisions, and it was exciting to see them all do well.

The *Scottish Highland Games* joined the program as something new this year and produced another 36 competitors as well as their spectators from several neighboring states to join in on the fun. The Highland Games is a competition that is totally different than the Strongman. For example, here are just a few that we were able to see:

Caber toss: A long tapered wooden pole is balanced vertically on one end. The competitor then runs forward and attempts to toss the pole end over end and lands facing directly away. Cabers vary in length, weight, taper and balance, all of which affect the degree of difficulty in making a successful toss.

Sheaf Toss: A bundle of straw (the sheaf) weighing 20 lbs. for men, or 10 lbs. for women and wrapped in a burlap bag is tossed vertically with a pitchfork over a raised bar (like that used in pole vaulting).

Stone Put: This is like the modern day shot putt, however, instead of using a steel shot, a large stone of variable weight is often used.

Scottish Hammer Throw: This event is like the hammer throw as seen in the modern-day track and field competitions. In the Scottish event, a round metal ball (weighing 16-22 lbs. for men, and 12-16 lbs. for women) is attached to the end of a wooden shaft, about 4 feet long and thrown.

Weight Throw: This event is also known as the weight for distance event. The weights are made of metal and have a handle either directly attached to the weight be a chain. The weight is thrown using a technique, but with only one hand!

Weight over the Bar: This event is also known as weight for height. The athletes attempt to toss a 56 lb. (4 stone) weight with an attached handle over a horizontal bar using only one hand.

Finally, the third new item joining the competitive weekend, was the arm wrestling, and we even had one of our Shrine Kids, little Ellie win! There were several competitors in different age and weight brackets that competed and won a nice trophy for their efforts.

Last but not least we had a World Class Para-Olympic Competitor join us for the day. His name was Alex Armor, who is a Canadian Wounded Warrior. He is a champion in the Para-Highland Games, Martial Arts, Boxing, and Strongman. He spent at least 30 minutes taking time to talk to our little Ellie, as well as some of the other children there that day. A special thank you goes out to Alex for sharing and taking time for the kids and their questions.

The Strongman group was coordinated by Nobles Charles Clayton and Arron Cramer, and last year they donated \$1,350.00 to the Temple general fund. This year they expect to donate even more. Thank you both for your efforts to keep Za-Ga-Zig strong!
