

First and foremost, a title change. We will no longer refer to it as a "Gun" raffle. It is now the "Za-Ga-Zig Shrine 4th Annual Gun & Gear Raffle." This year we are offering optics, archery, vouchers and other outdoors equipment as well as firearms.

Scheel's is once more our business partner for this event. Why? They offer us choice. You don't want the kayak you won? Scheel's will offer in exchange a voucher for the value of the item for ANYTHING in the store. This will open the raffle TO ANYONE AND EVERYONE, not just hunting and shooting enthusiasts. Hunting, fishing, clothing, artwork, camping, and any outdoor sport you can think of- Scheel's has something for everyone. This alone should generate higher ticket sales.

Another benefit about dealing with Scheel's? The first 2 years they provided our guns for our raffle, they wrote a check back to the shrine. This amounted to 10% of what we spend with them, putting our investment at only 5% above cost. Last year Scheel's gave us a financial contribution to start out 2018 and to help with our circus, even though we did not purchase from them last year. This alone speaks volumes about the commitment Scheel's has made to Za-Ga-Zig to partner with us for this

"What about me? How do I benefit?" You stand to benefit by selling your tickets. We are making a slight change to the tickets this year. Every book of tickets will have a "SELLERS TICKET." It will be the last ticket in the book and will be a different color. Once you sell the 5 tickets in the book, you will fill out the "SELLERS TICKET" and it will go into a special drawing for a gift certificate to Scheel's. There will be 10 of these tickets and the amount will be based on ticket sales. We are looking at certificate values of anywhere from \$100 -\$400. Also, the noble who sells the most tickets will get a gift certificate for \$400.00 to Scheel's and you still have a chance at the 10 "SELLERS TICKET" gift certificates.

"Wait? You mentioned that my unit or club benefit from this?" Yes. Any unit or club that sells \$1000.00 or more in tickets will receive 5% commission back to their unit or club. Clubs and Units Update as to Charitable Giving

A recent question came up concerning Clubs and Units, and this is a condensed version that was sent to our Recorder (John P. Miller P.P.), regarding these matters by John C. Piland Executive Vice President/COO of Shriners International. (The entire letter can be viewed in the Recorders Office upon Request)

"First as it relates to the power and control of clubs and units, the bylaws of Shriners International are very clear that units and clubs of the Temple are under the control of the Potentate. See Sec 336.1 and Sec.337.3 of the bylaws of Shriners International. While most clubs generally operate autonomously within the scope of authority provided to them by the temple Potentate, a club or unit that is disbanding cannot simply choose to dispose of club or unit assets which are property of the Temple.

If you can believe it, we had a circumstance in which we heard that a member of one of our clubs suggested that the proceeds of a disbanding Club simply be divided among its members. In other cases, we have heard of clubs attempting to provide the money to local charities unrelated to the Shrine. Such an action may be considered an unauthorized act as set forth in Sec.334.13(a) of the bylaws of Shriners International in that club and unit property is in fact the property of the temple and members of a disbanding club, which are, in fact, temple as-

The second question related to whether a temple, club or unit can consistent with the bylaws of Shriners International, provide money for charitable purposes other than Shriners Hospitals for Chil-

The specific provisions which is applicable to the question follows: "No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), Club, Unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations shall engage in any charitable fundraising activity other than for Shriners Hospitals for Children." General Order #, Series of 2017-2018, "Fundraising Activities", "2. Fundraising for Charitable Purposes", p.45

We should all be working for the benefit of our Charity, Shriners Hospitals for Children. If we are all pulling on the same side of the wagon, this question would never arise. "Shriners are brothers. We share a common creed and common goals and values. Our Creed Sec 210.2 includes a pledge to one another to support the SHC: "we believe Shriners Hospitals for children to be the world's greatest philanthropy, and we covenant with each other to support its "temples of mercy" with spirit, time, talent, and means." Therefore, when considering the goals, shared values and obligations as expressed in our bylaws, it would be difficult for one to suggest that charitable efforts for entities other than SHC by? Temples, clubs, units, or Shriners acting within their capacity as a Shriner are consistent with the bylaws.

year's budget for Shriner's Hospitals for children showed a budget deficit of roughly \$165 million dollars. Future budgets, based upon an inflation factor of 6% for healthcare, would indicate the budget deficits will soon be a quarter of a billion dollars annually assuming no additional services are provided. own charity faces extremely high budget deficits. While there are several other charitable efforts that are very worthwhile, none of them are "Our" Charities. It is also surprising that in the marketplace of good causes and charitable efforts, Shrine entities or Nobles (in their capacity as Shriners) would believe that there are charitable efforts worthier of support than our own charity. The question is sometimes raised requesting us to identify the specific prohibition on contributions to charitable causes other than SHC. I think a better question is why Shriners, in their capacity as Shriners, would prefer to support other or outside charities rather than the one we have covenanted with each other to support which is identified as our own.
