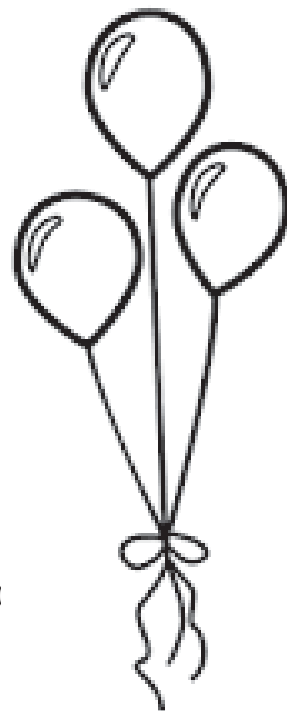
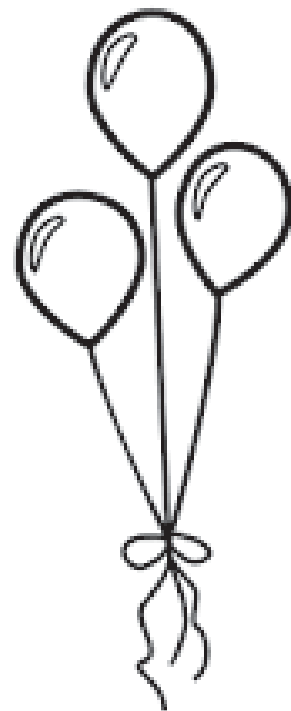

## Jerry R. Hoffman Fall Ceremonial Honoree

Illustrious Sir E. Jay Coon has selected Noble Jerry R. Hoffman as the Honoree for the Fall Ceremonial. He presently resides with his wife Ellie in Urbandale. They have 3 children, 6 grandchildren, 2 great grand children and #3 before this is published. They have great times with their 16+ family members.

Jerry was born in Shannon City, Iowa on June 11, 1939. He attended school there and graduated in 1957 and married Ellie in 1958. He attended Creston Junior College and graduated with an Associate of Arts Degree and began teaching 5<sup>th</sup> grade in Stewartsville Missouri in the fall of 1959. He moved back to Shannon City in 1961 and became elementary principal at East Union serving Arispe and Shannon City elementary schools. While at the Arispe school, a school board member took him by car over the noon hour and helped him learn the obligations of the three degrees of Freemasonry. 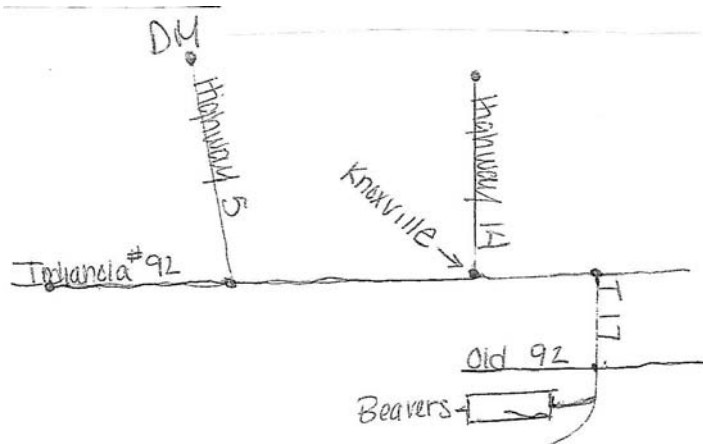
## Hillybilly Clan #112 Annual Hay Rack Ride
