

325.10 Election Regulations

(a) The printing, publication, circulation or distribution of resolutions, letters, tickets or other devices, by a Noble, suggesting, recommending, opposing or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the Temple is prohibited.

(b) For any violation of (a), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers' void and order a new election.

(c) At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the Temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice, thereof, containing this section.





Grand Lodge of Iowa Extended Invitation for Shriners to Join in the Festivities



God had to have somebody willing to ride the roads at double speed to get through the gauntlet of mines and IED's, and yet stop in the mid-route to help when he sees a civilian who was wounded in the crossfire. So God made a soldier.

God said," I need somebody strong enough to swim from ship to shore loaded with his pack, yet gentle enough to pick up, hold and nurse a puppy that wondered into camp from parts unknown, who will stop his job to help a friend who is struggling to complete his own." It had to be someone who'd march, shoot, run, salute and throw and jump and guide and navigate and love his neighbor, be willing to put the lives of others in front of his own, have unbreakable love for his country and unshakeable faith in his maker, So God made a soldier.

Somebody who'd hold his family together with the soft strong bonds of caring, who would laugh and then sigh and then reply, with smiling eyes, when his son says he wants to spend his life 'doing what dad does'.


