Remember we need the full page of declaration, not the card you keep in the glove box, which states your name, coverage, coverage limits, and dates of your coverage. Also, remember that if your insurance expires in July you will need to provide a second declaration page for the remainder of the year.

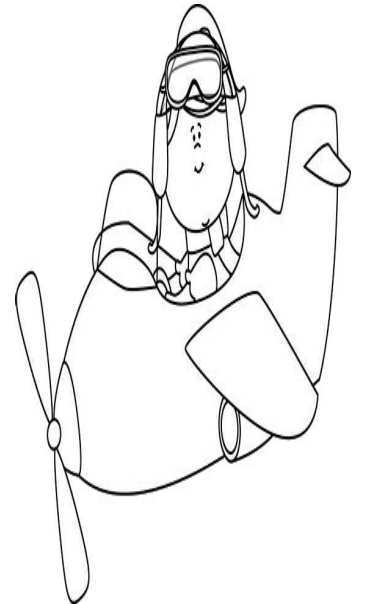
