Shriners Children Twin Cities Board of Governors



Happy New Year and thank you for a great 2021 serving as your representative on the Shriners Children's Twin Cities Board of Governors. After completing my first year on the Board, I am amazed at what our Healthcare System accomplishes and the lives that it changes. We have such a dedicated group of caregivers that deliver World Class Care to all of our patients. The other part of this is how we as Nobles and Ladies play such a huge part of the patient experience. This may be a little lengthy as we have had a lot of movement recently and you need to know the great work that is being done by so many.

First, the Blank Children's/Shriners Children's Affiliation discovered a need for car seats. We discovered that patients with casts and orthopedic devices were having to spend extra days in the hospital because the inability to be transported home by their parents and returned for follow-up visits. Now Blank had a car seat loaner program however this need was specific

to the Pediatric Orthopedic Clinic. I will tell you there are intricacies on funding this project however, Imperial Outer Guard Tim Forbis, Board Chair III, Sir Gene Reece, and our Twin Cities Administrator David Voller, cleared the hurdles for us to be able to fund the project. When, I presented the project to the 2021 Divan they were all in on supporting this project and committed the funds to get this program up and running. This was our first opportunity to provide direct support to our Blank Children's/Shriners Children's Twin Cities Affiliation. Thank you to the Elected Divan, Nobles and Ladies of Za Ga Zig. Look for more news on this as the seats are delivered and we have an opportunity to present them to the Clinic.

Our Town Hall meeting was a huge success! With over 110 Nobles, Ladies and guests we celebrated the first anniversary of the Affiliation with Blank and listen to presentations on what was happening system wide in addition to here in Central Iowa. 17 out of 19 Board of Governors, Imperial Sir Tim Forbis and Lady Peggy as well as Twin Cities Administrator David Voller, Dr. Luedtke and her husband Gary and Dr. Steve Stephenson, CEO of Blank Children's Hospital were able to attend the meeting in person.

Meetings were held with Blank Children's Hospital, Des Moines University and Childserve. The Board was treated to tours of the facilities, met with staff and leadership and see firsthand the medical innovations that

Dr. Luedtke and Dr. O'Brien are using to improve the care delivered to patients here in Central Iowa. The biggest take away for me was, the efforts being made to lessen the impact of prolonged hospital stays, more efficient use of technology to improve diagnostics and improve the patient experience.

As our Affiliation with Blank Children's Hospital evolves and blossoms we are going to be afforded more opportunities to participate locally. The Za Ga Zig Ladies Auxiliary has already started project to help provide needed items to patients. We are working on in-house volunteering opportunities also.

With all that said about Blank, patients are still being seen at the Twin Cities and other Shiner Children's

Facilities and we need to continue to use the referral program to make sure patients get the Best Care Anywhere!



Christmas Baskets 2021 ~ Our 49th Year

Yes, the baskets were first started in 1973 in the back room of Dutch Baayen grocery store. The Bowlers unit first did boxes of groceries for 6 families. Dutch handled the program for a couple of years. Art Carlson took over the programs and ran it until his health failed in 1992 with about 25 families. Super Value was our main resource for groceries then. We got toys from St. Vincent Depaul at that time.

I took over the program in 1992 and was lucky to get assistance from HyVee stores and the Marines Toys for Tots. We connected up with the Mobile Nobles in 2009 and expanded to 50 families the first year of that partnership. That was when we changed the program to the families picking up the food at the Shrine.

We now receive assistance from many Units and Clubs and the project has become a temple program.

The most families we have helped was 111 in 2019. Covid cut us back a little in 2020. This year we helped 99 families. We provided each family four boxes of groceries, a \$15.00 meat certificate, 10 lb. Potatoes, a case of water, apples and oranges, carrots, peppers, onions and bread. We also gave each child at least two toys or gifts thanks to Toys4Tots. We had a total of 279 children in the program this year.

We wish to thank the following businesses who have donated product of services to the program: HyVee in Chariton, HyVee on E. Euclid, HyVee in Altoona, Fareway in Altoona, Menards in Altoona, Capital City Fruit Co. in Norwalk, Summertime Potatoes in Des Moines, Sara Lea Bimbo Bakery, Ryder truck Rental, Crystal Clear Water, Great Escape Bowling, Yaw Auto Salvage, Dominos

Pizza in Altoona, Subway in Altoona, Cold Storage in Altoona and The U.S. Marine Corps Toys4Tots program.

A big thank you to all the Units and Clubs and the Masonic lodges who gave financial support to the program.

Thank you to all members and ladies who came out to help with sorting the 11 pallets of groceries and toys and then coming back the next day to help repack the products into the family boxes. Then, on Thursday, we handed out all

the boxes and etc. to each family. We have received several cards of thank you from the families.

I want to thank my Lady Rose for fixing lunch for the workers.

A big thank you to Jeremiah Allen (Lucky) who is working with me and has volunteered to learn the procedure and take over for me in the future.

Next year will be our 50th year to help families and we hope to expand to 120 families with everybody's help.
