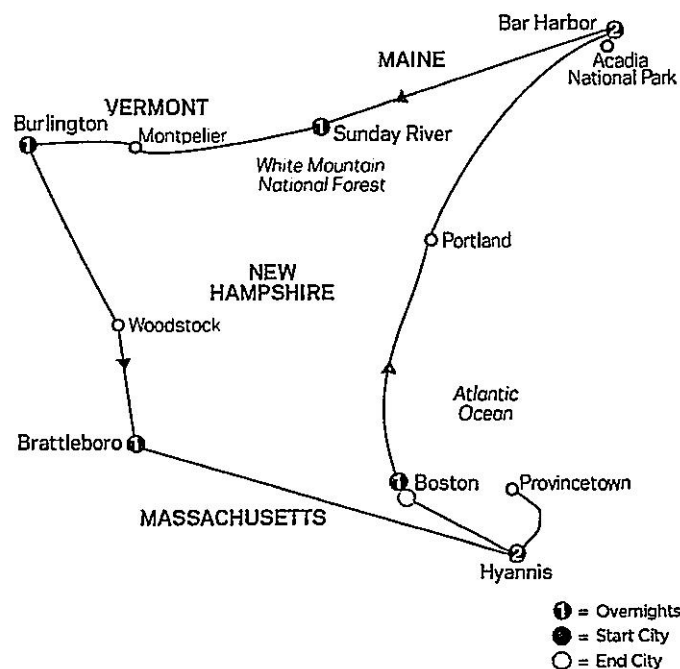

On Sunday, July 3rd, during the Imperial Session in Minneapolis, tours conducted by the Board of Governors were available for those attending the session. The WGA4Kids room was opened for attendees to learn about the WGA4Kids and the work we do. Elizabeth Ekholm, General Chairman and Kathy Flicek, Board Member were both present to answer questions and explain some of the projects.

Approximately 250 people stopped in to hear about what we do to raise money for wheelchairs, providing toys for the children who come for their appointments and the Christmas bags filled with toys given out during December. One of the most frequently and interesting questions asked was "why don't other Shrine areas have auxiliaries like this"? Many of the visitors took our new brochure with them to give to their local groups.

Both Elizabeth Ekholm and Kathy Flicek agree that it is so wonderful to have the support of the Board of Governors.

Meeting the Clinic Staff

This is a new section in which you will get to meet, in each newsletter, a different area of the clinic and its staff. I hope this will help us all understand what a wonderful job these loving and caring people do.

By quick introduction, I am David Voller, Clinic Administrator for Shriners Children's Twin Cities. I have 30 years of experience working in the healthcare space with most of that time being at Mayo Clinic and more recently at Gillette and a firm as a healthcare consultant. Being back in a direct patient care setting like Shriners is where

my heart has always been and as they say, my cup gets filled. Add to it that Shriners is in a pediatric space and I am elated. My education is a BS in Human Resources Management, an MBA from Augsburg College and I hold Fellow status with the American College of Healthcare Executives. While I had aspired to get my Ph.D., my wife said enough.

As you all are aware through aspects of your own personal health care needs, healthcare has changed. Orthopedics today is done primarily in an outpatient setting and care can be acquired just about anywhere a consumer chooses. I state this as such for these reasons, we no longer need 118,000 sq. ft. buildings to do what we can do in an 18,000 sq. ft. facility and through affiliations with partners. We do not need to have inpatient space and with more patients having greater financial responsibility with insurance, they are making the decisions of where to go. What this means to us is that we have to catch up to the change and function very differently than we have for the past 100 years.

So, here is to building the foundation for the next 100 years! And, it is going to look very different. Vision 2035, while as fast as things are moving should probably be Vision 2025, is a great platform for us to leverage how we need to practice differently. Vision 2035 is about how we can see more kids in more places (not necessarily Shriners brick and mortar) but virtually and through different partnerships. Affiliations with other organizations and leveraging the ability for patient to access all of our services without any

restrictions (therapy, POPS and imaging), regardless of their means to pay (insured, uninsured, government or self-pay), has to be the drivers if we want to stay relevant and compete for consumers in our market.

All of this doesn't mean our vision has to change. Our vision of WHY we do what we do is still 100 years strong and going. HOW we do it is what needs to change. Fortunately, have the commitment from all of our staff, our Board of Governors and each of you contributing every day in this transformation.

Keep doing what you are doing with the same vigor and commitment and while you too will see changes in how support the vision, the vision is the kids!

A new segment in your newsletter will be published by various members of our staff. This will allow each of you to have a little more opportunity to watch what we are doing so you can continue to help spread the word on the great things we are doing at Shriners Children's Twin Cities
