

# Back in Za-Ga-Zig History, 1949

This month begins the journey back in time- our time. Za-Ga-Zig Shrine and our amazing history when we were first chartered on May 23, 1900. As mentioned earlier, this will be a monthly feature.

The year is 1949. Astronomers discover another moon surrounding Neptune, a rich oil reserve is discovered under the Caspian Sea, the signing of the NATO Treaty happened on April 4, and the Soviets detonated their first atomic bomb on August 29<sup>th</sup>. Harry Truman was sworn in as our 33<sup>rd</sup> President for a second term, Israel was admitted to the United Nations and the Soviet Union lifts the Berlin Blockade and so the Berlin airlift ends. Za-Ga-Zig is 49 years young and Illustrious Sir Clem Dippert becomes our 49<sup>th</sup> Potentate.

Focusing on March, there is a photo of an invitation to Ill. Sir Clem Dippert's Potentate's Ball that was mailed to the Nobility. An error was made regarding the date of his ball, so a follow up postcard was sent out with the correction. Note the postage on this notification - .01. Postcard invitations and notifications were common up through the 1960's. Although we still send out postcard notifications to this day, we now rely more upon our **FEETPRINTS** and social media to get word to our Nobility.

On March 9, 1949 Za-Ga-Zig Shrine was visited by Imperial Potentate Galloway Calhoun of Tyler, Texas. The event was celebrated in an ALL MASONIC RALLY at the K.R.N.T Theater in downtown Des Moines. In his honor, Za-Ga-Zig presented an Oriental Pageant of its Uniformed Units following his address.

The final contribution is a short article that ran in the Bedford Times-Press. I included this to remind everyone that there are several outlying units and clubs that are significant contributors to Za-Ga-Zig Shrine. They carry our message for us in these "remote" areas of our jurisdiction. We don't often see the dedication and hard work that they put in, but we do hear from them and they deserve our support and appreciation.






