A Pre-Ceremonial Celebration Forecasting a Big Shrine Class

Back in Za-Ga-Zig History, 1941

Besides the events on December 7, Regis Toomey and Jane Wyman held the longest screen kiss at 3 minutes and 5 seconds in the movie "You're in the Army Now." More than 3 million cars were produced in the United States. Only 139 more cars were produced during the duration of World War II. Ford Motor Company was turning out one B-24 bomber every 63 minutes, 24 hours a day. The Orson Welles-directed drama film "Citizen Kane" had its world premiere at The Palace Theater in New York City.

With this month being our Spring Ceremonial, I thought it prudent to focus on membership, THE most important focus we all should have- not just once a month or twice a year. Za-Ga-Zig had a major push for membership in 1941.

Guest Stags (Prospect Nights) were a great way to recruit Blue or Rite Body lodge members to the shrine. The invitation was sent on a postcard. Most of these Guest Stags were held just prior to the Ceremonials. The idea to bring this event back was raised a few months back by Noble Joe White. We are working with the Elected Divan to do just that.

The Ceremonial invitations were also mailed directly to the nobility. Inside the mailer was listed all of the activities that took up almost a full day and going well into the evenings. Pageantry, Vaudeville acts, band concerts-these were common at our ceremonials.

We no longer have pageants, bands or acts at our Ceremonials. Should this lessen the importance or significance of recruiting high quality and outstanding nobles from our blue lodges or Rite Bodies? Of course not. New membership should be our most important business. With it we receive manpower, additional finances for our daily operations, and some bring with them an enthusiasm to get involved and help make a difference. New members are the key to shrinedom's very existence.

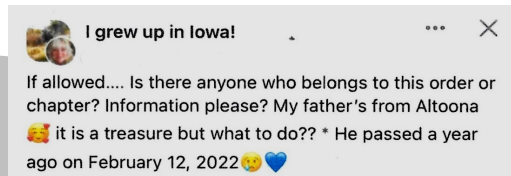

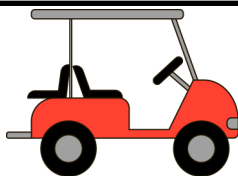

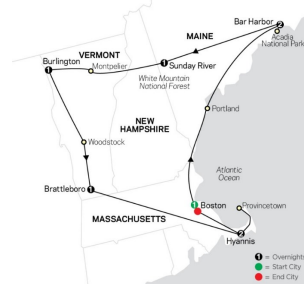

What is a Vidalia Onion?

In a nutshell, Vidalia Onions are a very mild, sweet onion that are grown in a specific territory in South Georgia (USA), comprised of 20 counties, centered around the city of Vidalia, GA and Toombs County.

For farmers to grow & call sweet onions 'Vidalia', it's required they be grown in this specific region, due to its unique blend of soil & nutrients that help produce their distinctive flavor. The Vidalia name is also protected through a federal marketing order, as well as a state law – making it illegal to grow & call a sweet onion a 'Vidalia' if it's grown outside this area.

Vidalia Sweet Onions are a standard Yellow Granex variety. And they're so mild they don't make eyes tear up when cut open – making them a friendly choice for budding cooks & chefs.

Vidalia sweet onions love the sandy loam soil and mild conditions of the southeast Georgia growing region. Temperatures in this area average in the middle 50s during winter, and middle 70s in the spring, with an average monthly rainfall of 3.5 inches during the growing season. This temperature and rainfall combination is ideal for growing Vidalia Sweet Onions.

When these onions are ready for harvest, their delicate nature requires they be harvested by hand, thoroughly dried & cured, and treated gently during grading and packing.

The Vidalia season start changes every year, as it's directly set by the farmers based on the readiness of the crop.

History of the Vidalia Onion

The Vidalia Onion story began over 70 years ago in Toombs County, Georgia. In 1931, a farmer by the name of Mose Coleman discovered the onions he had planted were not hot...they were SWEET! It was a struggle to sell the concept of a "sweet" onion, but Coleman persevered and managed to sell those first crops for \$3.50 per 50-lb. bag. In the 40's they began appearing on the shelves of Piggly Wiggly. Through the 1950's and 60's production grew at a slow but steady pace, reaching some 600 total acres of Vidalia Onions harvested annually by the mid 70's. Later 70's the Onion had achieved such success that it merited its own festival. In 1980, the Vidalia Onion official mascot was created; Yumion is a colorful character designed to appeal to children of all ages is a regular at area parades as well as nationwide events. There are about 15 varieties of onions approved for planting as Vidalias by the Georgia Agricultural Commission. The planting process starts by producing seedlings that are allowed to germinate in a controlled environment. Once enough of the seedlings have been properly germinated, they are inserted into the unique low sulfur soil by hand.

Harvesting typically occurs from late April through mid-June. The delicate nature of the Onions requires that they be harvested by hand. Standard practices in onion harvesting include undercutting the onions, allowing them to cure (air dry) for two to three days, clipping the tops and roots, bagging in burlap sacks, transporting to a warehouse, drying grading, bagging, or boxing and shipping.

Handle with care!

The water content in Vidalia onions is much higher than in regular storage onions. This characteristic contributes to Vidalias' sweet taste, but it also shortens their shelf life and makes them more susceptible to bruising.

To keep them at their sweet best, Vidalias must be handled and stored with care by the grower, the retailer, and the consumer.

Storage Tips & Handling

The water content in Vidalia onions is much higher than in regular storage onions. This characteristic contributes to Vidalias'

sweet taste, but it also shortens their shelf life and makes them more susceptible to bruising.

To keep them at their sweet best, Vidalias must be handled and stored with care by the grower, the retailer and you, the consumer.

The key to preserving Vidalias is to keep them cool, dry, and separated.

When stored properly, our Vidalias can last as long as 1-2 months on the counter, or 3-6 months when placed into refrigerator veggie bin (mentioned below).

Ways to preserve Vidalias for cooking

Dried. Chop onions evenly, spread on a cookie sheet, then bake using lowest temperature setting. Remove from oven when thoroughly dry, but not brown. Store at room temperature in airtight containers.

Chopped and frozen. Chop onions evenly, spread on a cookie sheet, then place in freezer. Once completely frozen, remove and seal in freezer safe containers or bags.

Frozen whole. Peel, wash, and core onions. Store in freezer safe containers or bags.

SHRINERS INTERNATIONAL GENERAL ORDER #1, page 26, paragraph 2, CIVIC PARADES, states

"In civic parades, and non-Shrine public appearances, nobles, their ladies, children, and masonic related or sponsored organizations may participate, with the approval of the Potentate. Only nobles may perform or compete in any vehicle, ride vehicles with fewer than four wheels, or operate any vehicles while parading, including participation with any of the clubs or units parading.

In those situations, where a specific license is required by a state, due to the size, weight or passenger carrying capacity of a vehicle to be used in a parade, and should there be NO MEMBER NOBLE PROPERLY LICENSED TO OPERATE SAID VEHICLE, the temple may hire a properly licensed driver with proof of the proper license required, and verifying that the driver has an acceptable driving record to any applicable insurance carrier(s). This driver MUST be added to the insurance policy, and accepted by the insurance company PRIOR to his/her operating ANY vehicle on behalf of the temple."

I therefore grant permission for noble ladies, children, and masonic related or sponsored organizations to participate in civic parades and non-Shrine public appearances, provided that their participation falls within the stated guidelines of General Order #1 stated above.

I also grant permission for these units or clubs to provide a properly licensed driver, if none is available, provided that they follow and meet the guidelines as stated in General Order #1 stated above.

ZA-GA-ZIG SHRINE BY-LAWS, ARTICLE 8, PROHIBITED PRACTICES, paragraph 3 ALCOHOOLIC BEVERAGES states that "the consumption of alcoholic beverages during parades and ceremonials is forbidden by those nobles participating therein."

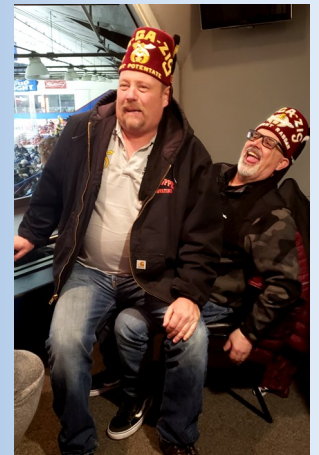
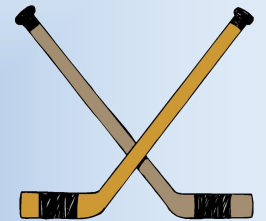
