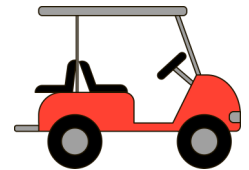

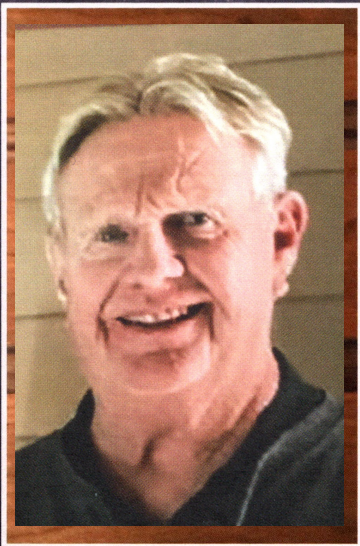
We have had our first 2025 circus meeting, starting to work on contracts and updates for rides.

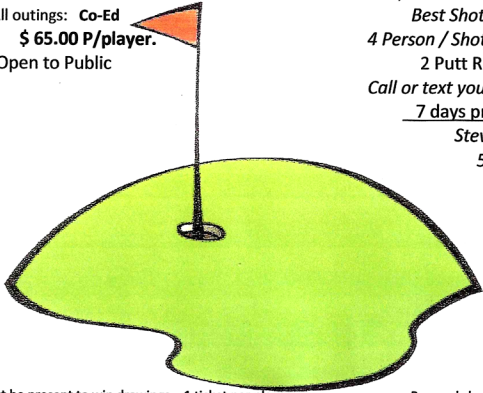

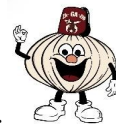
